Year 6 Update

We hope you have all managed to have a lovely half term break and are ready for another busy half term! This half term, our topic is Lighthouses, and we will be completing lots of exciting and interesting work in our Writing, Geography, Science and Design and Technology.

Year 6 Tim Peake

English:

In our writing lessons, we will be writing our own enlightenment-themed stories after watching an animation about a lighthouse keeper. The grammar features we will continue to use in our writing will be semi-colons, relative clauses, cohesion between paragraphs and parenthesis, as well as passive voice and varied sentence structures. We will also be writing senses-themed poems as well as an explanation text.

Maths:

This half term, we will be learning how to add, subtract, multiply and divide fractions; calculate percentages; add and subtract decimals and multiply and divide by 10, 100 and 1000.

Reading:

This half term, our class novel is 'Letters from the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll. We will be exploring the text in detail and using it to answer different styles of comprehension questions.

Reading days:

All children will receive a reading book and record with details of your child's reading day. It is expected that children will read their book at least 3 times per week and have their reading record signed by an adult.

Please can you make sure that your child brings their reading book and record to school every day.

Read Theory:

All children now have accounts for the 'Read Theory' app, which they can access on their Chromebooks. This will help them to rapidly increase their reading level and understanding. On the app, they must read a short piece of text, then take a quiz answering questions about it. If they get the questions right, the computer will give them something harder next time; if they get them wrong, the computer makes the next challenge easier. This means that they should always have challenges which match with their reading level.

PE:

This half term, both classes will be playing **tennis** in their outdoor PE lesson and doing **dance** sessions in the school hall. For outdoor PE sessions, children are welcome to bring in any warmer clothing such as jogging bottoms or a hoodie/ tracksuit. It is essential that all children wear non-branded, plain T-shirts and bring trainers or pumps on PE days. They are allowed to come to school in PE kit on PE days.

Homework:

Each week, children in Year 6 will receive Grammar, Maths and Spelling homework.

Details of when it is given out will be communicated to you on Class Dojo.

Spelling homework will be set on Spelling Shed and there will be a spelling test every two weeks.
